EMS Director Chris Johnson was present to give updates regarding EMS. He stated that one of the challenges was employment recruitment, although the retention was good. The Rapid Response Vehicle has been a tremendous success, as it provides quicker response time to the victim. They will be adding a Field Training officer this month, which will be able to mentor others. Some of the incentives they are offering to attract and keep employees are: Flexibility time, compensation per run, longevity bonuses, gym reimbursement and a base rate increase, which is one of the highest of surrounding counties. They have ordered 2 new trucks and are revamping monitors, which are paid in full. Director Johnson stated over 56% of their employees have been there more than 7 years and there are 13 employees who have been there for over 12 years. Commissioner Hensler, Commissioner Willis and Commissioner Haller all praised Director Johnson for the great job he has done with Jackson County EMS. They have spoke with surrounding counties who seems to be struggling with several issues, but Director Johnson and his staff have done exemplary work in making Jackson County stand out in a positive way.

**Health Commissioner Kevin Aston** was present to discuss the purchase of the property @ 102 Twin Oaks Drive for their new Health Department location.
