**CORSA's Managing Director John Brownlee and CORSA/local insurance agent Steve Pritchett** were present to give the 2023 program update. The annualized premium contribution for Jackson County is 6.84%. The 2023 coverage enhancements are: Increase Land/Water Clean-up from \$10,000 to \$50,000, as well as an increase in Schedule I and II controlled substance from \$35,000 to \$50,000. Mr. Brownlee stated the total program costs for this year was up approximately 7.1%. Membership increased to 72 counties and 44 affiliates in 2023. Regarding the 2023 Cybersecurity Reimbursement Program, in order to get the \$2,000,000.00 in coverage, the counties will be required to implement multi-factor authentication and endpoint detection, which is approximately a 6 month ramp up.
