Ms. Allman stated that 4-H enrollment numbers are all up from previous years, and the Jackson County Fair will be July 16<sup>th</sup> through the 22<sup>nd</sup>, featuring market steers, lambs, goats, etc...as well as ducks, which is a new category this year. 4-H has hired Dan Watson as the 4-H Stem Program Assistant (grant funded). Mr. Watson will work closely with all the local school districts in providing educational 4-H programs. Ms. Allman stated that registrations for 4-H summer camp are now available, which is held at Canter's Caves. Mr. Winters stated that the pesticide recertification was done in February and went well. Ag Day is always a success, which attracted approximately 400 students this year. Commissioner Willis stated the county has made a big investment in Agriculture and commended both Mr. Winters and Ms. Allman for their work and dedication and in seeing results in their investment.
