Scioto Township citizens Teresa Davis and her daughters, Grace Moore and Amy Newman attended the meeting to voice their concerns regarding the following issues with a proposed data center in Scioto Township: Environmental concerns, as well as water, electricity, pollution and a lack of transparency regarding the connection, if any, to the Atomic plant in Piketon, Ohio. Ms. Davis stated that all the information that she has is rumor, and she would just like clarification. Commissioner Willis stated they had been informed of a private company approaching property owners, but as far as what company and what they are discussing, the commissioners have not been made aware. Ms. Davis said she had been approached by ORC who is contracted by AEP wanting to put transmission lines on her property but not an actual data center. Commissioner Hensler stated they have no authority over a private company negotiating with private land owners, unless there was county-wide zoning, which most constituents are not in favor of either. There will be a community meeting on March 17th @ 5:30 p.m. at the Scioto Township Firehouse and the Commissioners were invited to attend to hear what the resident’s questions and concerns are, and ask for complete transparency going forward.
