OSU Extension Educators Joshua Winters and Maddie Allman Winters were present to give their quarterly updates. Maddie presented her April – June quarterly updates, pointing out that Canter’s Cave hosted 2 international staff for the summer from Australia and the UK in addition to 3 students from Ohio for training with the staff. Maddie also served as a co-camp director for the Southern Ohio Horse Camp in Adams County in June, to which Jackson County 4-H participated in for the first time. She also authorized a successfully funded Capital Improvement grant application from the 136th General Assembly through S.B. 450 which funded \$250,000.00 for a new ATV/Pedestrian Bridge at Canter’s Cave 4-H Camp, authored a grant for the Jackson County 4-H horse committee who received \$10,000.00 from the J. Floyd Dixon Fund to make improvements to the 4-H horse arena and facilities at the fairgrounds, as well as receiving a \$3600.00 donation from the Arby’s Foundation for their fundraiser in March. 21 hogs were donated to the “Fill the Freezer” during the fair, which was a huge success.

Joshua presented the commissioners with the Fair Sale Summary. Total bids: \$480,648.35, Total Flooring: \$80, 786.36, with a total summary for 2026 of \$399,861.99. Joshua stated he visited between 4-5 farms per week looking at damage to crops caused by the stinkbugs. He also stated that 11 out of 12 townships are participating in the rain gauge comparison in the county by partnering with Soil & Water. Joshua also stated that the last 2 ½ years have been rough for those growing hay, but there is government funding for losses if they carry hay insurance and qualify.

Engineer Melissa Taylor that townships are now eligible for sign grants. Franklin Township was the first to ask Melissa if they could replace signs at intersections with a county road and township road. The county engineer stated she recently found out that township road signs were not her responsibility, and she has a lot of signs in stock and would like to donate these signs to respective townships and let them install them, while following Ohio Revised Code 307.12 section d.
